Festival Choral Eucharist in the Nave

There is a thread I am hearing in every direction about how we are in a place of many in-betweens. It is one of the most challenging impasses in life and where the church finds itself.

Now, I am terrified of heights. The fear of falling is my reoccurring dream. If I have to jump off a high diving board, the more I think about it, the less likely I am to let go. But this feeling of in-between makes me think of an acrobat in midair. Consider this poem by Cristiano Luchini entitled Passion in Midair: The Inner Life of an Acrobat.

"The acrobat soars in the emptiness, which emptiness is never, because in itself it contains infinite energy which is the same infinite energy of her body, tense and vibrant. Blinded by the lights, deafened by the catacomb silence, somersaulting on herself, the acrobat also makes somersault her heart that hammers with passion and that shouts: "Fly and Love, Love and Fly." Adoring, a cosmic Thought of happiness caresses her with maternal gentleness. The aerial magic has been completed. The roar of the crowd tears the silence, which silence is never because in itself it contains infinite energy which is the same infinite energy of her body, now grateful and relaxed."

I love that. With Ingathering Sunday and discerning the vision of St. Paul's in the coming year, and the announcement of the slate of candidates for our next bishop, we are like acrobats aren't we? I wonder if you are like me and feel like we are in flight, not yet falling but reaching through the air for something or someone to catch us. We are "faith-filled," like the generosity we have shown in our stewardship.

It is also similar to the three weeks in between All Saints' Sunday and the season of Advent. It is in between time in

the church. The lessons appointed in scripture for Sundays are all about anticipation and preparation; key themes of Advent yet we aren't there yet. In fact, for the first one thousand years of our faith, the church recognized forty days of Advent to mirror Lent.

Someone told me just this week that these final Sundays in ordinary time feel like a recap of what happened in a television show before starting a new season.

This makes me wonder if you feel that way... like the inner life of an acrobat. You are in midair, full of passion. I imagine this is what it feels like when you buy a house but haven't yet sold the old one... or opportunities come around and you are torn whether to go for it or stay in the familiar. It is the hardest thing not being anchored in the ground or grabbing onto a rope.

And I believe more and more that God calls us to be disciples who are willing to be acrobats. Yes we love to be planted and rooted but those times are proving more rare all the time. But I wonder if we are called to love and fly in midair. "Wait on the Lord; Be of good courage, And God shall strengthen your heart; Wait, I say, on the Lord!" *Psalm 27:14.*


