There's an App for that!

Tt feels like there is a smartphone app for just about everything these **■** days. Want to know what the weather is like in Auckland, New Zealand? There's an app for that! Want to play the entire archive of New York Times crossword puzzles? There's an app for that too! There are tons of apps geared towards devotions, praying and liturgy as well. As we get back into the rhythm of the school year, I invite you and your family to make use of these apps to develop a family practice of prayer.

Two apps that I really like are sponsored by the Episcopal Church: d365 and Venite. The d365 app is a daily devotional experience that follows a five-step format of pause, listen, think, pray, go. It's easy to use and each member of the family can take turns reading during the devotional. The Venite app puts the services of the Book of Common Prayer daily office and the scripture readings all at your fingertips. You can select the liturgy you want to pray from Morning Prayer to Compline, and just follow the automatically generated service. It is essentially the BCP in app form!





I hope these apps can serve as tools that allow you and your families to take a break from the busyness of the world and draw closer to God through prayer and scripture. —Mtr. Katie

The St. Paul's Music Series has been a part of the musical L life of the Meridian community for many years. The Series was established decades ago by the late Albert Weems, and the performances by talented performers over the years has been a part of a parish musical outreach program. However, with the onset

of the pandemic, musicians were prevented from sharing their talents with our parish family and friends in our area.

The good news is we are planning to remedy that — beginning in October the first St. Paul's Music Series program will return.

Mark your calendars for Oct. 12, noon, and be sure to come to hear Impromptu Piano Quartet. One of the more popular groups performing for us in recent years, this group always presents the highest caliber of chamber music for piano and strings. Their musicianship never fails to excite the listener and some of their performances have left audiences breathless.

On Thursday evening, Nov. 17, at 7 p.m., the Series will present "Music of Thanksgiving." This event, held in the

church, will feature a number of soloists and a community choir; and the audience will join in singing some of our favorite hymns of thanksgiving. Although the music will be sacred, this is not a St. Paul's parish service, but rather a community wide celebration of our tradition of Thanksgiving.

> To round out the calendar year, we are pleased and excited by the return of Capital Brass Thursday, Dec. 14, at noon. Capital Brass has long been one of our annual Music Series presentations and

this December event always puts us in the spirit of Christmas.

In the new calendar year of 2024, more programs will be announced. As we do not have performances during Lent (and Lent comes very early next year), we are setting our sights on one event in January and a concluding gala to round out the season.
