
Vestry Nominations Open

Nominations are open to elect three new members of the Vestry to serve three-year terms. Forms for nominations are available at the entrances to Nave and on the bulletin board in the hallway and will be accepted until Jan. 15, 2023. A potential vestry member must be a confirmed communicant, at least 21 years of age, must be canonically resident and actually residing the parish (letter of membership on file); must be entitled to suffrage at annual meeting at which elected; cannot have served on the Vestry in previous three years (though such person is immediately eligible to stand for nomination as Warden); and shall not serve more than six consecutive years in that or a combination of vestry member/warden offices unless said individual has served a portion of a former term (i.e. filled an unexpired term).

Prior to the Annual Parish Meeting, potential Vestry members will meet with the Rector; consent to the parish's Vestry Covenant; and commit to attend the Annual Vestry retreat, which is scheduled for Feb. 11, 2023.

We Did it For Christ

Twrite to you on the final day of ■ November, the day after severe weather in Mississippi. I am discovering after five Decembers of living in Mississippi that Advent to us looks a little bit different as we approach the winter solstice, when nights grow progressively longer and longer. Yet, where we live, temperatures are as likely to be cold or as warm as 60 or 70 degrees as they have been this year.

This volatile weather in these darkest days of the year still captures the mood of Advent. The words of this seventh century hymn capture the mood too. They speak to the stars, the moon, the planets and what we call the cosmos. For the ancients, all these things in some unfathomable way affected the course of human destiny as if they were living and breathing things.

This hymn helps remind us of all the parts of scripture that speak to

the whole created universe and how God is present in all of it. As we enter a new season of the Church, we will hear from Matthew "the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give her light, the stars will fall from heaven, and the powers of heaven shall be shaken." (Matthew 24:29)

It can be scary to think about. It is about as scary as huddling in hallways or basements when our phones alert us of tornado warnings. Yet, just when the world seems doomed, the Sun (with a capital S) comes forth in a blaze of

light and begins its paschal journey across the whole of human life and experience.

his imagery is reversed with the birth of Christ, the Sun of Justice who comes to us out of perfect love.

And then, from Matthew, Jesus says this:

"When the Man of Heaven comes in his glory, and all the angels with him, then he will sit on his glorious throne. Before him will be gathered all the nations, and 'Truly I say to you, as you did to one of the littlest of these my dear people, you did it for me."

So, the invitation for us, as we hear Matthew's version of the Gospel, is it is how we live and wait in the meantime. God does not want us to live in fear but to be alert, and to reflect the Sun; bring light to the world in the way of love. My prayer is that "When Christ comes in glory," St. Paul's

can say we "did it for Christ," as in, we remembered and cared for "littlest of these." Together, I pray we explore how we can hold onto this part of the Gospel and live it.
