Where is Your Hidden Treasure?

onsidering our season of stewardship, I want to ✓reflect on this year's theme "hidden treasures."

"The kingdom of heaven is like a treasure hidden in a field," Jesus says, "which someone found and hid, and then in their joy sells everything they have to buy that field." But I wonder what the treasure contained that the person found and, if countless other people had

walked right by that treasure before, unaware that it was even there.

We do know that treasure is something of great value to us. But in the parable, the container holding the treasure is referring to a strongbox, something that contains great riches and beauty but the

strongbox is unattractive. What we discover inside is contrary to our expectations.

Jesus reminds us in this parable that, in fact, the kingdom of heaven is everywhere around us, hidden in plain sight.

That the kingdom of heaven is learning to perceive spiritual beauty, creation with resurrection real and present. Consider this poem by Henri Nouwen, entitled "The Treasure of God's Love."

"You have found a treasure: the treasure of God's love. You now know where it is, but you are not yet ready to own it fully. So many attachments keep pulling you away. If you would fully own your treasure, you must hide it in the field where you found it, go off happily to sell everything you own, and then come back and buy the field.

You can be truly happy that you have found the treasure. But you should not be so naive as to think that you already own it...Having found the treasure puts you on a new quest for it. The spiritual life is a long and often arduous search for what you have already found. You can seek God only when you have already found God. The desire for God's unconditional love is the fruit


of having been touched by that love.

Because finding treasure is only the beginning of the search, you have to be careful. If you expose the treasure to others without fully owning it, you might harm yourself and even lose the treasure. A newfound love needs to be nurtured in a quiet,

intimate space. Overexposure kills it... Finding treasure without being ready yet to fully own it will make you restless. This is the restlessness of the search for God. It is the way to holiness. It is the road to the kingdom. It is the journey to the place where you can rest."

In the coming year, I pray that our hearts may be open to seeing sacred treasures hidden in plain sight. I hope that God gives us the grace to see the work ahead of us, so that God's people in Meridian can witness and share this treasure too. Treasures of goodness, kindness, generosity, reconciliation need to be uncovered and are not to be hoarded. I look forward to hearing about how we continue to find the hidden treasure of God's love, and how St. Paul's will share it at God's table and wherever we find it and take it out into the world.

Finding the Treasure

We're all familiar with the stewardship Trinity — time talent, and treasure. We usually think of treasure as the money part. Because it exercises so much control over us, giving money away is critical to good stewardship.

We don't literally "hide" our money, usually. But many of us have money beyond our needs that we hide in the sense of concealing from ourselves the liberating power of giving it back to God.

This is the greatest "hidden treasure" of our stewardship theme. Layers of protectiveness and insecurity hide from us the joy that comes when we trust God completely and respond more generously and gratefully with our financial gifts. Peel back those layers and we can find spiritual treasures we never knew were there.

My hope is that all of us at St. Paul's come a step closer this stewardship season to that joyful discovery.
